OUR VENUE

Philip Pullman, author of the magical trilogy *His Dark Materials*, was also an undergraduate here, basing his fictitious Jordan College on Exeter.

Finally, the powerful imagery and symbolism of alchemy will be linked with astrology, offering a profound exploration of astrology as a science of the soul.

Many techniques used by modern astrologers have their roots in medieval or even earlier periods, markedly different from our contemporary approaches. In this track, we will explore various traditional techniques and examine how they have been adapted to fit our modern, client-centred system. Special attention will be given to accidental dignities, alongside other methods such as firdaria, directions, profections, primary directions, and solar returns. These techniques will be presented, demonstrated and integrated into client work and exploring our own charts.

Additionally, we will cover other fascinating themes, including aspect patterns or unaspected planets. A particular focus will be placed on the vital role of the Sun in the natal chart and on electoral astrology for magical healing, practical daily applications, and specific individual events. Finally, we will explore the upcoming Saturn/Neptune conjunction, particularly in relation to the activation of the natal Mars.

FIVE-DAY COURSES: CHART INTERPRETATION

These courses are designed to build skills and confidence in chart interpretation within a supportive learning environment. Although they have been created for students of the Faculty of Astrological Studies, Module 3 may also be taken by students who have an appropriate level of knowledge. Early booking is strongly recommended as places are limited.

On Sunday 17th August registration for both *Chart Interpretation* and *Astrology in Action* courses (see previous page) will take place between 2pm and 5pm. A welcome and introduction at 5pm will be followed by a drinks reception at 5.45pm.

Track 1 Astrology, Psychology and the Archetypal World

9.30 The Animus Reimagined: Archetypes, Gender and the Women in Jung's Life

Alejo López | Quarrell Room

Carl Jung's idea of the animus as an archetypal pattern of so-called masculine principles within women is our starting point. We will critically examine this notion and its gendered assumptions to reflect on its significance in contemporary psychological and astrological contexts. We will then explore this archetype in the lives and astrology of two of the most important women in Jung's life: Emma Jung, his wife and collaborator, and Toni Wolff, his lover and fellow analyst. This session is independent from the following sessions about the anima and inner marriage.

11.30 The Anima Explored: Archetypes, Projection and the Lives of Freud and Jung

Alejo López | Quarrell Room

Building on Carl Jung's theory of the anima archetype, an inner pattern of so-called feminine principles within men, we will re-examine this concept from today's cultural and psychological perspectives, challenging its gendered framework and exploring possible broader implications. Focusing on the lives and astrology of Sigmund Freud and Carl Jung, we will study how the anima may have influenced their roles and relationships. By using these examples, we will aim to deepen our understanding of the anima as a complex and transformative force within us all. (You do not need to have come to the previous session to attend this one.)

2.30 The Inner Marriage: Anima and Animus Reunited

Alejo López | Quarrell Room

In this session we will revisit the anima and animus archetypes from a contemporary perspective, exploring how they can be identified in astrological charts. You will be guided in applying this framework to your own chart so that you can reflect on how these archetypes may have manifested in your life. The session will conclude with insights into integrating anima and animus, in the so-called Inner Marriage, an alchemical process symbolizing self-understanding and fulfilment. Attendance at previous sessions on anima and animus is not required, but may be beneficial. Please bring your chart for an interactive and reflective experience. All levels of astrological knowledge are welcome.

4.30 The Shadow of Narcissism: Power, Myth and the Underworld

Alejo López | Quarrell Room

Narcissism is often associated with the astrological Sun or 5th house. However, in Greek mythology, it was a narcissus flower that Persephone was picking when she was abducted by her uncle Hades. In this session, we will explore the relationship between the concept of narcissism and Plutonian archetypes, uncovering a deeper, hidden and shadowy dimension to this concept. But beware, just as Persephone came to realise her own desire for power, you might discover there is also a narcissist within you.

Track 2 Magical Connections: Exploring Relationships

9.30 Part 1: In Relationship with the Stars

Christian König | Rector's Drawing Room

In this session, we delve into the philosophical foundations of predictive work with fixed stars. Everything in the universe moves in cycles: day and night, life and death. While transits and progressions reveal the rhythms of life on Earth, they offer only part of the picture. Beyond the Sun, Moon, and planets lies the realm of fixed stars, which connects us to the soul's journey and the spiritual dimension. This session provides the essential groundwork for understanding and applying the practical techniques explored in Part 2.

11.30 Part 2: In Relationship with the Stars

Christian König | Rector's Drawing Room

In this session, theory transforms into practice. We will explore how to calculate and interpret 'star-periods' – unique life phases influenced by specific fixed stars. Each period unveils a chapter of your spiritual journey, revealing themes unique to your individual path. By combining star-periods with transits and progressions, you will uncover a balance between the spiritual and material aspects of life. This approach provides insights into the 'art of living', inspiring you to navigate your journey with the creativity of a true 'artist of life'.

2.30 The 12th House: Bonding and Letting Go

Glòria Roca | Rector's Drawing Room

The water houses represent three different aspects of the emotional plane; they describe the experience of bonding with significant others, which we need in order to feel safe and have opportunities for development. The 12th house contains material that come from our ancestors. We unconsciously express our ancestral inheritance when building emotional bonds, so we are shaped accordingly. But the 12th house is also about letting go and surrendering to something bigger than ourselves. How can we create bonds and let go at the same time: experiencing this two-way process in our growth as individuals?

4.30 The Ascendant: Our Door to Life Through Relating

Glòria Roca | Rector's Drawing Room

Because it is entirely determined by our time and place of birth the Ascendant represents where it all began for us. Its condition by sign, aspects and possible planets accompanying it, as well as the condition of its ruler(s) – the chart ruler(s) – will give us our personal symbols for beginnings and the way in which we relate to others at a personal level. It will be active every time we initiate something or embark on a relationship, and we use it both to preserve our personal integrity and establish consistency within the relationship and to maintain it.

Track 3 Revisiting Old Techniques

9.30 Ancient Wisdom for the 21st Century: How to Read Your Natal Chart Medievally

Chris Mitchell | Saskatchewan Lecture Theatre

Medieval astrology may be ancient, but you can adapt its techniques today in your own natal chart. In this session, you'll learn how to approach your own natal chart using a variety of medieval methods. We'll look at essential and accidental dignity to identify which planets you can focus on, and medieval houses to see where they play out, giving you a toolkit that will help you use these techniques in your own practice and integrate them with the modern techniques you already use. Bring your own chart with you so you can try these out!

11.30 Ancient Wisdom for the 21st Century: Integrating Medieval Predictive Techniques

Chris Mitchell | Saskatchewan Lecture Theatre

Medieval prediction uses a number of techniques that are very different from our modern ones. In this session, we'll look at several of these, including firdaria, directions, profections, and solar returns, and then show you how you can integrate all of these and map out the future for you and your clients. Try these techniques on your own chart!

2:30 Planets in Accidental Strength: Potential and Power

Frances Clynes | Saskatchewan Lecture Theatre

The traditional technique of essential dignities of the planets is still used to some extent in modern astrology in the form of domicile, detriment, exaltation and fall to show the potential strength or weakness of a planet depending on its zodiacal position. But that is not the whole story. The traditional technique of accidental strength describes the planet's power to act regardless of its zodiac sign. This talk will look at how planets in detriment and fall can be your unexpected asset.

4:30 Owing Our Aspect Patterns

Frances Clynes | Saskatchewan Lecture Theatre

Aspects patterns are a fundamental part of chart interpretation in psychological astrology. Liz Greene describes them as patterns of behaviour which have an archetypal core and can act independently from consciousness. This talk will look at some of the aspect patterns we might experience as challenging, with examples of how, when activated by transits and progression, they can be forced into our awareness.

9.30 Part 1: The Power of Patterns:

Self-Exploration for Astrologers

Christian König | Saskatchewan Lecture Theatre

In this first session, we explore Jeffrey Young's Schema Therapy, an integrative approach which combines psychodynamic, behavioural and humanistic psychology. We examine how past experiences shape our schemas – unconscious patterns that influence our thoughts, emotions and actions. Through a psychological questionnaire, we analyse our own schemas and their impact on our astrological consultations. This self-awareness helps us recognise projections and respond more clearly and attentively to our clients' concerns. This first part forms the foundation for the next session and is therefore an essential prerequisite.

11.30 Part 2: The Power of Patterns:

Self-Exploration for Astrologers

Christian König | Saskatchewan Lecture Theatre

In the second part of these linked sessions, we build on the insights from Part 1, reflecting on how our patterns influence our astrological consultations. We explore the strengths our patterns bring to client interactions, as well as the challenges they may present. The focus is on recognising the dynamics of these patterns and consciously managing their influence on the astrological process. Both sessions form a coherent journey of self-awareness. Without the insights from Part 1, this part offers limited value. Both sessions provide useful insights for astrological practice, but are not intended as psychotherapy.

2.30 Beyond the Wounded Healer

Frances Clynes | Saskatchewan Lecture Theatre

We are familiar with Chiron as the archetype of the wounded healer and how, in our charts, it can show the transformative healing potential of our deepest wounds. But it is much more than that. This talk will focus on Chiron and what we have learned about him since we first met him as a celestial body forty-eight years ago.

4.30 Chiron in Manifestation

Frances Clynes | Saskatchewan Lecture Theatre

Following on from the previous session, this talk will look at examples of the way in which Chiron has manifested in the charts of individuals, and what happens when he is activated by transits and progressions. Attendees may bring their own charts for discussion.

Track 2 Magical Connections: Exploring Relationships

9.30 Growing Through Hard Aspects in Synastry

Glòria Roca | Rector's Drawing Room

We relate to others with all the facets and archetypes of our psyche, but some relationships place remarkable emphasis on certain parts of our psychological material, sometimes not in a particularly comfortable way. However, these difficult feelings can be the most important sources of personal growth and development for us, although we need to manage them creatively and with much love, in order to turn them into something constructive. This is what the hard cross-aspects in synastry are about. In this session we will explore conjunctions, oppositions and squares as indicators of these potentially creative tensions in relationships.

11.30 Growing Through Minor Aspects in Synastry

Glòria Roca | Rector's Drawing Room

Minor aspects in synastry represent subtle interactions between two individuals' psychological dynamics. However, subtle does not mean unimportant. Sometimes minor aspects in synastry can create profound discomfort between two people without them having an idea where that discomfort comes from. When this is made conscious, it can be the key to both individuals' development. Also, the minor aspects is that they teach us invaluable lessons in self-confidence and trust. In this session we will explore semi-sextiles, quincunxes, semi-squares and sesquiquadrates as indicators of this potential for growth through our relationships.

2.30 The Magical Connections of Mercury: Myth and Archetype

Lisa Stockley | Quarrel Room

As the planet of communication and connection, Mercury can play a more compelling role in our relationships than we might expect. From the very first moment of connection, the role of Mercury as communicator, guide and even trickster makes Mercury an alchemical catalyst for the growth we inevitably find in the crucible of our closest relationships. Using example charts and drawing on myths and archetypes of this god of liminal spaces, we'll consider the role of Mercury in the mysterious interface of a relationship: the space between two people in which each are transformed.

4.30 The Magical Connections of Mercury: Personal Chart Connections

Lisa Stockley | Quarrel Room

In this second session looking at the role of Mercury in relationships, we'll take a practical look at Mercury in our own charts and its impact on our relationships. We'll consider the nature of our unique liminal relationship space, looking at Mercury's connections with planets associated with feelings, such as the Moon and Venus. We'll reflect on our own communication patterns and how they impact our relationship needs and patterns. Does Mercury keep us on the surface or guide us into the depths? What kind of connections do we seek and how do they catalyse our growth? Bring your chart and an open mind!

Track 3 Revisiting Old Techniques

9.30 Rethinking Planetary Rulerships and Dignities

Marielle Churaqui | Quarrell Room

Are traditional rulerships and dignities still relevant in modern astrology? This talk delves into their historical origins and reimagines their significance in contemporary chart interpretation. We'll explore fresh ways to apply these traditional principles, creating a bridge between ancient wisdom and modern astrological practice. By examining the charts of renowned celebrities and attendees, we'll uncover how planets in rulership or dignity express themselves in shaping personalities, lives and achievements. This session offers insights to deepen your understanding of planetary rulerships and dignities, helping you refine and enrich your astrological interpretations.

11.30 The Wild Cards of the Chart: Understanding Unaspected Planets

Marielle Churaqui | Quarrell Room

Unaspected planets function without the influence of other planetary connections, expressing their energy in raw and unpredictable ways. These celestial wild cards often shape lives with unique intensity. In this session, we'll uncover their significance, explore how they manifest in personality and life experiences, and analyse real chart examples. Discover the untamed power of unaspected planets and their profound role in shaping destiny.

2:30 Part 1: Electional Astrology for Magical, Healing and Day-to-Day Uses

Cat Cox | Rector's Drawing Room

Electional astrology has always been a pillar of our traditional astrological practice, woven into magic, healing and alchemy to guide the timing of these arts. This 'universal' form of electing predominantly works with the natural significator of the matter and underpins the more complex 'particular' electing used for our individual purposes. In this first session we will reflect on what it may mean philosophically to choose a time, in contrast to interpreting a chart, and establish the principles of universal electing which are used for herbalism, magical work and day-to-day practice, and which form the basis for all electional astrology.

4:30 Part 2: Electional Astrology for Individual Events

Cat Cox | Rector's Drawing Room

In this second session we will build on these universal principles to develop the more complex work of particular electing that is used for specific events across the range of human experience and might include choosing a time for a marriage, beginning a business, launching a website, signing contracts or buying a house. Traditional textbooks of aphorisms can be complex or confusing; however, we will develop a set of clear principles to guide our contemporary practice.

11.30 Astrology, Leadership and Organizations: Introducing Archetypes at Work™

When leaders develop themselves the workplace climate adapts and thrives. This lecture introduces a unique method that blends astrology with leadership principles to foster personal development in leaders and teams. As we die to our old, adapted, selves, ancestral and cultural distortions are gradually purged and released, and we find ourselves reborn into a profoundly new way of being, conscious of ourselves as both individual and universal.

Track 2 Magical Connections: Exploring Relationships

9.30 Part 1: Relationship as a Path to Growth: The Mysterious Attraction of the Other

Cat Cox | Rector’s Drawing Room

Astrology, both through its modern influence from depth psychology and its innate appreciation of the connection between inner life and our outer world, has embraced an understanding of projection. Understood as a natural part of human relationship, Jung described this phenomenon as a bridge to the world, whereby part of our unconscious psyche is projected onto another in order to bring an aspect of ourselves to consciousness. In these two sessions we will explore how working with the astrological chart can bring insight and understanding to these mysterious and powerful experiences. In this first session we will look at love relationships and consider the experience of falling in love as a projection of a divine aspect of ourselves.

11.30 Part 2: Relationship as a Path to Growth: The Magnetic Challenge of the Other

Cat Cox | Rector’s Drawing Room

In this second session we will explore the nature of the shadow, the experience of meeting the shadow through another and early family or ancestral influences which can contribute to these experiences. In both sessions we will consider chart factors, cross aspects and the dynamic astrology of transits which can bring awareness and meaning to help understand these powerful and transformative relationships.

2.30 Friendships Are a Two-way Street

Lindsay Gladstone | Quarrel Room

‘Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one’s life for one’s friends.’ This biblical quote describes the heroic power of friendship. But, how often friends are discarded when an intimate love partner enters the social circle. In this session, through the lens of Venus, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune, we will consider the reasons why an enduring friendship is rated as far less important than that of a transient love relationship.

4.30 A Hand of Friendship

Lindsay Gladstone | Quarrel Room

A handshake can carry great symbolic importance and communicate unspoken depth of feeling. Politicians use it as a symbol to mark historical concord. Amongst friends, it can be a supportive reassurance in times of crisis and grief, while for lovers, walking hand in hand is a public gesture of their affection. In this session, we will look at the planet Mercury, in medical astrology the ruler of the hands, and looking at our own charts consider its effectiveness of communication through the reverent act of shaking hands.

Track 3 Revisiting Old Techniques

9.30 Part 1: Primary Directions

Primary directions are one of the most ancient predicting techniques used in astrology. In the first part of this lecture, we will explore the theory behind the idea of ‘directing’ an astrological chart based on the primary motion of the sky. 9.30 Part 1: Muses, Mentors, Gurus and Guides: the Astrology of Inspiration

Some of the most important relationships we have in our lives are with those people who inspire and motivate us; such individuals may also be friends or lovers, but often they are neither. In contemporary Western astrology solar returns are a familiar technique in our forecasting toolbox. However, they have been used for centuries, including during classical times, in medieval Arabic astrology and in the early modern era by such astrologers as William Lilly. Also known as solar revolutions, in this session we'll look at the theory and practice of solar returns as they are used now and as they've been used historically. With plenty of chart examples, we'll look at the evolution of the technique, including differing interpretations and the always thorny question of location.

11:30 Part 2: Solar Returns: Applying the Techniques Lisa Stockley | Quarrell Room

In this second session looking at the changing art of solar returns, we'll work with our own charts to compare historical and contemporary techniques and interpretations. We'll compare different approaches and consider how varying interpretations might align with our lived experience. As well as considering the solar return chart in its own right, we'll compare it with the natal chart, since as Lilly says: 'for upon a right understanding thereof, the strength of judgement in a Revolution depends.' Bring your natal chart, your solar return chart and astrology software if possible.
